The IRD – Do You Owe Them Money?

The IRD are becoming aggressive about debt collection and are chasing non-payment of tax, particularly income tax, GST and PAYE. Aiding this process is the May 2014 Budget announcement of increased funding to the IRD for the collection of outstanding tax and returns.

Recent amendments to legislation will now allow IRD to bankrupt taxpayers particularly in situations where the taxpayer has taken excessive drawings or lived an extravagant lifestyle.

There have been a number of recent tax cases where taxpayers have been prosecuted for non-payment of PAYE and GST. If you are an employer the PAYE you deduct on behalf of your employees is held on trust for those employees and is required to be paid to the IRD. The IRD take a very dim view of the non-payment of PAYE.

While the IRD are responsible for recovering the maximum amount of debt in the most efficient manner, they must also ensure any debt recovery does not place a person in serious hardship and in some circumstances the IRD can write tax debt off (if hardship conditions apply).

If you have tax arrears that you are having difficulty repaying then contact your accountant who can discuss the various options available to you. If you don't have a repayment plan in place for your IRD debt, you will continue to be charged penalties, so prompt action will save you money.

Accounting Systems In The Clouds

Accounting package suppliers are offering cloud solutions in all flavours. For a long time MYOB dominated small business accounting in New Zealand and Australia. Today it is competing with Xero, Reckon, and intuit, the four of which are the main accounting software players in the New Zealand market. Australia has all these and its own Saasu.

The most common of the four software options are MYOB and Xero, with recent commentary in the public domain reporting that "Xero is a long way in front in terms of sheer performance. It also beats competitors with mature apps for mobile phones and tablets. Business people on the move can do everything on Xero, perhaps saving more complicated reporting for when they are in front of a PC".

MYOB has a wider range of products. Xero is onesize-fits-all or more accurately three-sizes-fit-all. MYOB has products for different tiers of business and with differing levels of cloud integration.

If you want something a little more specialist, say inventory control, you'd need to buy a third-party add-on product to use with Xero. MYOB covers inventory in its own range.

Before deciding whether a cloud accounting system is right for you and your business, consider 3 key questions:

- 1. How good is your internet connection speed?
- 2. Do you have the time to get training in and administer a cloud accounting system and keep it up to date?
- 3. Is your time better spent working on/in other areas of your business?

If you're not interested in accounting and want to keep life simple, it may be best to leave the decision about which software to use to your accountant.

ACC

Workers and Employers will pay \$387 million less in ACC Levies in 2014/15. The savings affect the Earners Account (paid by the workers) and the Work Account (paid by the employers), as demonstrated in the following:

Year	Work Account Average Levy (per \$100 of liable earnings, excluding GST)	Earners Account Levy (per \$100 of liable earnings, excluding GST)
2014/15	\$0.95	\$1.26
2013/14	\$1.15	\$1.48

The Health and Safety in Employment Levy is changing to a flat rate of \$0.08 per \$100 of liable earnings.

Motor Vehicle Account Levies, incorporated into car registration and petrol prices will remain the same.
